Six Degrees Lounge reminds one of older establishments in Chicago and New York, where the bar extends nearly the length of the club and most of the socializing happens in the front or back. The shotgun-style layout gives this new downtown club a laid-back, cozy atmosphere.

The décor centers around dark-wood paneling and muted colors, complemented by antique-looking light fixtures that cast a warm glow over the entire room. Great abstract art (by Nicola Parente) adorns by the right wall, while huge screen prints of black-and-white Warhol-esque nudes hang to the left.
